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**STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
TO MEET IN ANDERSON ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15, 2016**

***PUBLIC ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND AND PROVIDE INPUT ON THE  
ADOPTION OF LAND CONSERVATION AND CONVEYANCE PLANS FOR  
LANDS IN FRESNO, SHASTA, AND PLACER COUNTIES, AND A  
CONSERVATION EASEMENT HOLDER RECOMMENDATION IN MADERA  
COUNTY***

**San Mateo, Calif., June 1, 2016** – The Pacific Forest and Watershed Lands Stewardship Council, a land conservation and youth investment foundation, announces its next board of directors meeting will be held in Anderson, CA on June 15, 2016. The Stewardship Council Board of Directors (Board) may take action on the following agenda items related to its Land Conservation Program, as well as on other matters.

*Land Conservation and Conveyance Plans*

**FRESNO COUNTY:** Board adoption of the proposed Land Conservation and Conveyance Plan for lands to be retained by PG&E at the Wishon Reservoir planning unit.

**SHASTA COUNTY:** Board adoption of the proposed Land Conservation and Conveyance Plan for the Fall River Valley planning unit.

**PLACER COUNTY:** Board adoption of the proposed Land Conservation and Conveyance Plans for lands to be retained by PG&E at the Lower Drum (Old Airport) and Lower Drum (Rock Creek) planning unit.

*Conservation Easement Holder Recommendation*

**MADERA COUNTY:** The specific recommendation made by the Watershed Planning Committee that will be considered by the Board on June 15 is as follows:

The Sierra Foothill Conservancy (SFC) is recommended as the prospective holder of the conservation easements to be established over the lands located at the Manzanita Lake planning unit.

If the above conservation easement holder recommendation is approved by the Board, the Sierra Foothill Conservancy will enter into negotiations with PG&E and the County of Madera regarding the terms of the conservation easement over the lands in the Manzanita Lake planning unit that will be retained by PG&E and donated to the County, respectively. The conservation easements, along with all other transaction documents, will become part of the Land Conservation and Conveyance Plans (LCCPs) developed for this planning unit. The LCCPs will be considered for adoption by the Board at a later date after an opportunity for public comment. Adoption of an LCCP by the Board is

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the final step in the Stewardship Council's process for selecting entities to receive donations of conservation easements or fee title to PG&E Watershed Lands.
